The single best defense against the flu virus is obtaining an annual vaccination, which protects against various strains of the disease. While the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends every person age 6 months and older be vaccinated, community members age 50 and older, those who suffer from chronic medical conditions, and pregnant women should particularly be vaccinated as they are at an increased risk.

Influenza ("the flu") is an infection that affects your respiratory tract (the mouth, nose, and lungs, and the passages between

them). Unlike a cold, the flu can make you very ill. And it can lead to pneumonia, a serious lung infection. For some people, especially older adults, the flu can be fatal.

By taking a few basic precautions, you and your loved ones can stay healthy this holiday season.

- Wash your hands often. Frequent handwashing is a proven way to prevent infection.
- Carry an alcohol-based hand gel containing at least 60 percent alcohol. Use it when you don't have access to soap and water. Alcohol gels kill most germs

and are safe for children.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- At home and work, clean phones, computer keyboards, and toys often with disinfectant wipes.
- If possible, avoid close contact with others, especially children.
- If you're 65 or older, ask your doctor if you should receive the pneumonia vaccine.

Image-guided systems are essentially like GPS (global positioning satellite) systems for the anatomy of your head. These systems are used to aid the surgeon in the confirming the location of critical structures, especially when the interior of the nose and sinuses is distorted by unusual anatomy or prior surgery.

A CT scan of the sinuses is performed using a specific navigation system protocol. The CT scan is transferred to a disk, which is then loaded into the image-guidance computer.

During surgery, a detection array is placed on the patient's head. The CT scan images loaded into the system are then calibrated to the patient's anatomy using pre-set reference points. The position of the sinus surgery

instruments can then be tracked by the computer by integrating the information detected from the patient's pre-set reference points and comparing it to the information on the CT scan map.

The end result is a Three-Dimensional visualization of your sinuses and surrounding anatomy where the surgeon can see the location of instruments in real time while surgery is being performed which increases the overall safety for our patients.

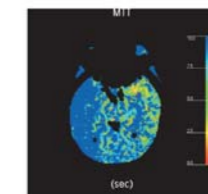
CT scanning — sometimes called CAT scanning — is a noninvasive medical test that helps physicians diagnose and tailor treatments for various medical conditions.

Ultrasound imaging of the breast produces a picture of the internal structures of the breast.

MRI is a noninvasive medical test that utilizes magnetic fields to produce anatomical images of internal body parts to help physicians diagnose and treat medical conditions.

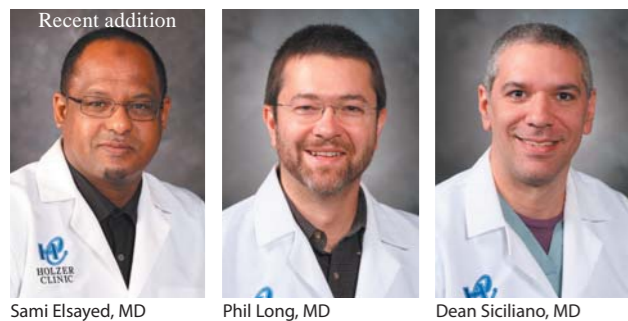

The landscape of medicine is constantly changing, and for the past 30 years, interventional radiologists have been responsible for much of the medical innovation and development of the minimally invasive procedures that are commonplace today. Interventional radiologists pioneered modern medicine with the invention of angioplasty and the catheter-delivered stent, which were first used to treat peripheral arterial disease.

Today many conditions that once required surgery can be treated non-surgically by interventional radiologists. Through a small nick in the skin, they use tiny catheters and miniature instruments so small they can be run through a person's network of arteries to treat the site of illness internally, saving the patient from open invasive surgery.

While no treatment is risk free, the risks of interventional procedures are far lower than the risks of open surgery, and are a major advance in medicine for patients.

Interventional radiology is a recognized medical specialty by the American Board of Medical Specialties. Interventional radiologists are board-certified physicians with additional advanced training in minimally invasive, targeted treatments

to quickly adapt their imaging expertise to pioneer nonsurgical treatments that are guided by imaging. Because they are first trained in diagnostic radiology, they use imaging to understand, visualize, and diagnose the full scope of the disease's pathology and to map out the procedure tailored to the individual patient. During the procedure, they then image as they go, literally watching and guiding their catheter to the site of the problem.

When it comes to the best practices for safely performing minimally invasive medicine, interventional radiologists pioneered the procedures and the standards for safety and quality.

Explore Deep Water Running to Splash Up Your Fitness Program

The American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM) recommends individuals to perform 20 to 60 minutes of continuous aerobic exercise at least three to five times a week to obtain cardiovascular, weight loss, and overall fitness benefit. Aerobic exercise has been shown to reduce risk of cardiovascular disease and diabetes. Ideas of exercise can range from utilizing aerobic equipment at fitness centers, jogging, biking, walking, and swimming.

Another alternative that is often overlooked is deep water running. Deep water running provides the benefit of performing a higher level of exercise to assist an individual with working at the frequency recommended by ACSM with less compression on his or her joints. Deep water running not only alleviates 90% of an individual's body weight, but provides a resistive medium in all directions to strengthen not only the legs, but the whole body. Deep water running is performed in a depth of water in which the individual's feet are not touching the surface of the

pool. Equipment is required with deep water running, such as floatation belt or ankle floatation cuffs. A floatation belt is the easier of the two, due to providing support for the runner to maintain vertical alignment in the water. When using ankle floatation cuffs, the individual must coordinate his or her abdominal muscles and lower body muscles more to stay vertical in the water. These types of pool equipment can sometimes be found at facilities that provide swimming. These items can possibly be ordered online or possibly through a business that handles pool equipment. A tether cord can be used to jog in place, if enough area is not available to run the length of the pool. Please note that this form of exercise may not be appropriate for severely weak or deconditioned individuals, and all individuals should seek consent from their physician before performing an exercise program.

The following guidelines will assist an individual with his or her posture with deep water:

- Jogging mechanics are the same as on land.
- The water line should be at the

shoulder level. The mouth should be comfortably out of the water.

- The individual should be looking straight ahead and not down.
- Arm motion is identical to that used with running on land with primary motion from the shoulders with hands held lightly clenched.
- Keep light tension in your gluteal and abdominal muscles to assist with staying vertical in the water.
- Continuous motion of both legs with one leg reaching forward and the other extended back similar to land based running with exception that the feet are not touching the ground.

Deep water running has been shown to be beneficial for individuals with rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis, obesity, low back pain, knee pain, athletes, or individuals seeking a different mode of exercise for various reasons. Erin Nehus-Vergara's victory brings her one step closer to Gold

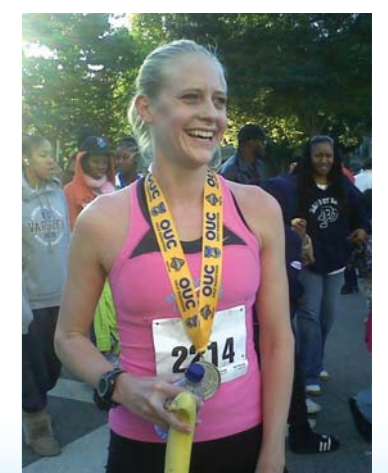

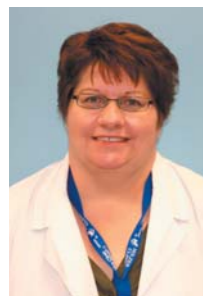

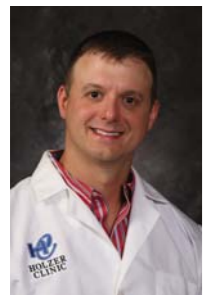
